


Think Sunshine

There will be a tech session on November 7, at 12 noon, at Jim Craig's 4906 Johnson Ave. in Portsmouth. Phone 488-6843. Tools, all lubricants, points, workshop manual and help available. If you need work done, come on out with your parts.

Directions: From Norfolk: Come through the downtown tunnel and get onto the interstate (I-264). Exit at Victory Blvd. Turn right at the traffic light. You are on Victory Blvd. (Continued below)

From the Beach: Proceed down the toll road and get onto I-264 towards Chesapeake. When you come to the Bowers Hill - Portsmouth fork, turn right towards Portsmouth. Exit at Victory Blvd. Turn left at the traffic light. You are on Victory Blvd. Go straight at the next light. (Continued below)

Now everybody: Go straight at the next light, proceeding down Victory Blvd. in the left lane. Turn left at the next traffic light (you will be facing a Coca-Cola plant). Pass Toyota dealer on your left. Zayres will soon be on your right. Turn right between Texaco station and Shoney's (across from Plymouth dealer) onto City Park Ave. Follow City Park Ave. (it winds around a little) until you come to a traffic light (7-11 on your left). Go straight and bear right to stay on City Park Ave. Turn right on Johnson Ave. - Byers Ave. - City Park Ave. intersection. If you cross the railroad tracks, you just passed the tech session.
